On 13th May, Dr Reece Goodall from University of Warwick joins us to discuss La Haine, directed by Mathieu Kassovitz.

In this interactive session designed for French language students (groups and individuals), Reece will offer the context and language to really explore the film, initially discussing the banlieues in politics, culture and film, before moving on to specific insights into La Haine. Reece will guide students through themes and techniques to support their analysis and understanding of the film.

Criminal Justice System: Child Anonymity - Aberystwyth University - 15 May

On May 15th, we consider the potentially serious consequences for children who have committed crimes of being identified, and the consequences for their families, for victims and their families. Dr Kathy Hampson, Senior Lecturer in Criminology at Aberystwyth University, joins us to explore whether children should ever be identified.

James will look at the methods organisations can use to choose between two investment opportunities and will pay special attention to Net Present Value Analysis and the potentially dramatic impact of the cost of capital.

Sport/Sport Psychology: Coaching or Bullying? - Solent University - May 16

Jon Cooper is a Lecturer in Sports Coaching in the Department of Sport and Health at Solent University and, on 16th May, Jon will explore the question Coaching or Bullying?

Jon explores the role of a sports coach to provide a safe and positive environment that can promote sports participation, support talent development and facilitate peak performance before considering when "good" practice becomes "poor" practice. Importantly, poor practice, intentional or otherwise, can be perceived as bullying or even abusive. In the session we think about this crucial awareness and distinction to better understand

what best coaching practice might look like and how we can ensure that all sport participants have a safe, enjoyable and beneficial experience.

In this interactive workshop, students will assess and respond to an emergency medical situation, navigating a variety of intricate clinical and psychosocial dilemmas.

Philosophy/Religious Studies: Metaphysics of God - UEA & Leeds - May 20

Dr Philip Wilson at UEA will consider how the God of the theists could ever interact with the world and looks at other versions of God, from theistic personalism to panentheism, asking what it might mean to conceive of an absent God.

Dr Gregory Stacey at Leeds will follow, noting that many analytic metaphysicians believe that there are abstract objects such as properties, numbers, and sets but, if God exists, how does He relate to such objects? In particular, Gregory will consider whether the existence of abstract objects provides evidence for either theism or naturalism.
