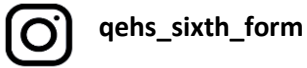




We ask students and their parents to research fully any opportunities advertised in the bulletin to ensure they are happy with the organisation they are linking with and its value for money if there is a cost.

A Week in the Life of a Space Engineer 2024

Telespazio UK, with support from the North-East Local Enterprise Partnership, is excited to announce its 5-day Space and Satellite Communication inspired engineering experience.

Monday 29 July - Friday 2 August 2024

The event is open to applications from year 12 STEM students local to Newcastle upon Tyne. (The venue is within walking distance of both Newcastle Central Station and Haymarket Metro and Bus Interchange.)

It's free to attend and will give students the opportunity to discover the key skills required and pathways available into a career in the space industry.

During the 5 days, participants will develop their own satellite mission design project, attend space-related seminars, engage in technical demonstrations and the opportunity to visit a space related facility. The week will end with a presentation of each group's design project; judges will award a prize to the winning project.

Education: Parental Engagement & Why Does It Matter? Warwick - May 21

Dr Mark Pulsford from University of Warwick argues that parental involvement in Education reveals a range of issues that pose challenging questions and prompt us to think about social inequalities, ideas of community, and even the purposes of schooling.

Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship with Northumbria Uni

Choosing to become a Police Officer is the start of a career you can be proud of. This three-year work-based programme combines practical “on the job” training and academic learning, based on a national policing curriculum.

The training programme will begin with an initial 17-week period of class-room based learning at Coach Lane campus focusing on areas including law & legislation, understanding police powers, and elements of effective communication. Following this, you’ll work alongside experienced officers as part of a shift in a response team. You’ll have a dedicated tutor to guide you through your first 12-15 weeks, who will help you build your skills and offer practical and pastoral support.

You’ll be supported and given everything you need to succeed in the PCDA programme. And, upon successfully completing all elements of the PCDA, including operational and academic assessments, you’ll be awarded a BSc (Hons) degree in Professional Policing Practice and will become a fully qualified substantive police officer.
