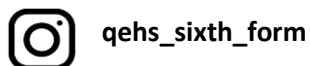




We ask students and their parents to research fully any opportunities advertised in the bulletin to ensure they are happy with the organisation they are linking with and its value for money if there is a cost.

Film/Media: The Filmmaker's Toolkit with UEA - June 11

Dr Alec Plowman, Lecturer in Media Production at UEA, argues that, for those setting out to make movies, 'the range of tools at our disposal is incredible, but also completely overwhelming'.

In this live interactive skills-based session, Alec considers what you actually need in your 'toolkit' as a filmmaker. Complementing equipment choices, we look at the importance of film storytelling and collaboration in order to tell stories that resonate with viewers and find an audience.

Psychology/Criminology: 1. Investigative Psychology & 2. Free Will vs Determinism - Aberystwyth & UEA – 11 & 13 June

On June 11, Dr Dakota Ward, Associate Lecturer in Criminal Justice at Aberystwyth University, will look at the key principles and theories which explain criminal behaviour and help to apprehend unknown offenders, whilst considering the evolution of criminal profiling. In addition, we will reflect on the portrayal of criminal profiling in pop culture as well as introducing the profession of Behavioural Investigative Advisors.

Visit Newcastle University's Excavations at Birdoswald on the World Heritage Site of Hadrian's Wall on Saturday 22 June 2024, from 09:45 to 16:00.

The day will start at 9.45 at Great North Museum, Claremont Road, Newcastle-upon-Tyne where you will meet, and a coach will take you out to Birdoswald.

Once on site, you will have a tour of the roman site and excavations, a chance to see some of the very latest finds, and an opportunity to see some leading-edge technical equipment. The day will also include a taster lecture to help set the scene and to show how innovative research is changing the way we understand the frontier communities of the Roman Empire.

Virtual Insight into University

Insight into University (previously known as Headstart) is a comprehensive virtual experience allowing students to explore STEM studies at university and the career opportunities that these subjects lead to. It provides access to information on university and student life, STEM projects and activities set by leading UK universities and global STEM companies, first year undergraduate lectures, live interactive sessions with academics, admissions tutors, employers and current students.

When is it?

The experience will run from 1st July until 23rd August 2024 and can be completed flexibly to fit around other commitments and study at a pace that suits individual circumstances.

Who is it for?

The experience is open to all students age 16+ and is suitable for all abilities, with activities that cover different levels of advanced study. All students need is a genuine interest in STEM and inquisitiveness about what the future can hold for them and how they can help get themselves there.

University: Widening Participation (some of the criteria universities use to assess eligibility are: household income, receipt of free-school meals/sixth form bursary, first generation in a family to attend university and living in an area with low progression rates to university). Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower offer from the university.

Northumbria Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust are organising a 'Pharmacy Masterclass' on Thursday 11 July from 10.00am – 17.00pm. This is offered by the widening participation team to allow students, regardless of background, the opportunity to explore their future career. It is aimed at current students in year 10, 11, 12 and 13 with an interest in pharmacy as a career.
