#### Car Park Use

As you know, the safety of our students is our main priority. Since the start of this term, we have noticed an increase in the number of vehicles on and around the school site. School staff continue to be present around the site, including on Whetstone Bridge Road. We are asking for your support with the following arrangements.

#### Morning drop off

If parents could avoid driving onto the school site to drop-off, that would be a big help. Please consider:

• Whether local children could walk to school.

- Whether children could be dropped off away from the school site to walk the final part of the journey.
- Whether car share arrangements could be made.
- Whether public transport could be used.

However, if none of these is practical and you do need to drop your child at school, please note the following:

- Stay in the flow of traffic to the top of the car park. Please do not drop off at the corner but pull along the top lane towards the EVC bays. This speeds up drop off for all users.
- Only drop your child off at the designated area (fenced off for safety) do not park up in a bay or look for shortcuts in the car park as this is dangerous.
- Do not overtake other vehicles in the car park. We have witnessed near misses due to overtaking. If you can't wait, please use an alternative drop-off away from the site.
- Do not drive across car park spaces/lanes(?) unless you are parking up to visit school. (Not sure I understand this one).

When leaving the car park, it would help if vehicles could **turn left**, avoiding the need to stop the flow of pupil movement as they cross Whetstone Bridge Road.

### End of day collection

We ask parents/carers to consider whether you could meet your child elsewhere to reduce the number of vehicles on and around the school site.

- The car park should not be accessed after 3.15pm.
- If you arrive before 3.15pm, you should drive into the car park, stay on the outer loop and park your car with your engine turned off.
- If you arrive after 3.15pm, you should park off-site and not enter the car park.
- There will be no vehicle movement in the car park between 3.15pm and 3.30pm.
- Any vehicles moving will be asked not to use the car park in future. This is important to keep all pupils safe as they leave school.
- Once the barriers are removed, vehicles can leave the car park, taking a left turn at the exit.

#### **Attendance**

We believe that attendance at school helps students to progress socially, emotionally and academically. Being in school, meeting people and doing activities helps social development and positive mental health. When we review outcomes data there is a clear correlation between attendance and performance. Students make better progress and achieve higher outcomes when they attend. In the newsletter each week I will show you our current attendance data for each year group. Our school target is 95%. We know that some students will struggle to attend school so please speak to their form tutor, Head of Year or Mrs Curry if you have any concerns. We work with families to help students overcome barriers to attending school.


### LRC recommended read
