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| Paper: Topics/ areas of study which could come up in the exam: | Love Through the Ages: [2 hours] Section A: 'Othello' [1 HOUR] <p style="text-align: right;">[Closed text]</p> <p>Students will be given approx. 40 lines from the play + will need to make wider links to whole play. They must show a keen awareness of implications of staging; use of verse/prose; use a range of technical dramatic terminology; integrate critical debate and discuss significance of social, political, religious/ literary, and ideological context.</p> <p>ONE COMPULSORY QUESTION</p> <p>Key areas/ themes to revise:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Betrayal• Lust• Tragic love• Friendship• Destructive Love <p>Section B: 'Wuthering Heights' + selected pre-1900 love poetry AQA anthology <p style="text-align: right;">[Open text] [1 HOUR]</p></p> <p>CHOICE OF TWO QUESTIONS</p> <p>Themes/areas to revise:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Romantic love• Passionate love• Longevity in love and relationships• Loyalty in love and relationships• Envy in love and relationships <p>In this section of the exam, students must focus on making comparative links between the novel and 3 selected pre-1900 love poems. They will need to comment on effects of language, form and structure and how aspects of love are presented in the writers' work.
