Piercings

We have seen a recent increase in students with nose and additional ear piercings. A reminder that the school uniform policy is clear that nose piercings are not allowed and earrings should be limited to two in total. Students will be asked to remove all additional piercings and failure to do so will result in students being sent to Reflection for the school day. Students may wear clear retainers however, **school will not provide these** and students must bring their own. As ever, we would advise all students to get any new piercings done at the beginning of the summer holidays to allow them to wear them for a sufficient time to avoid the hole closing up. Students will be asked to remove all piercings and clear retainers for PE lessons in accordance with health and safety guidance.

QEHS Parent/Carer Survey

Each year we survey parents and carers to seek their views on various aspects of the school's provision. In recent years, the feedback has led to a return to face-to-face parents' evenings, a reworking of the Y9 options processes and a review of our behaviour system. It has also helped us to sustain the good work we have been doing and share positive messages with staff.

Attendance

Being in school, meeting people and doing activities helps social development and positive mental health. When we review outcomes data there is a clear correlation between attendance and performance. We know that some students will struggle to attend school so please speak to their form tutor, Head of Year or Mrs Curry if you have any concerns. We work with families to help students overcome barriers to attending school.

not once


call back.

For Parents - What is Financially Motivated Extortion?

FMSE is where someone threatens to release explicit images of a child victim unless they pay money or other financial demand (such as Bitcoin, pre-paid gift card etc.). It is a form of child abuse which is sadly getting worse.
